

**Psychonomic Society Best Poster Award  
Instructions - 2025**



**Award Premise:** CCS will honor an outstanding poster presentation by a graduate student member of the society with a \$300 prize from the Psychonomic Society.

Abstracts and posters will be judged by the CCS Awards Committee. Entries will be judged based on general scientific merit, innovation/novelty of the work, clarity and organization of the information on the poster, visual appeal, appropriate and interpretable presentation of results, ability of presenter to clearly and succinctly describe the rationale, methods, findings and conclusions and answer questions, overall professionalism

We strongly encourage applications from diverse peoples. The CCS seeks to address structural inequities in science which disproportionately burden specific groups that are represented by (but not limited to): Indigenous peoples, race, ethnicity, national origin, sex, gender identity and expression, sexual orientation, disability, socio-economic status, age, and religion.

**Award Eligibility:** Applicants must meet the following eligibility requirements:

- Must be a CCS graduate student member at the time of application.
- Must be the presenting author on an accepted abstract for a poster at the 2025 Conference on Comparative Cognition.
- Abstract must be submitted to the conference using the regular submission portal by the regular submission deadline, designated for the Poster Award session.
- Must submit only one application for consideration for the award.

**Award Application Process:** Students and postdocs wishing to be considered for this award need to submit the following information:

- Name and email
- Affiliation (Institution, Department)
- Program (i.e., MA, MS, PhD.)
- Year in the program (i.e., 2nd year, 4th year)
- Endorsing supervisor name and email
- A letter of endorsement from the student's supervisor that endorses the abstract and its contents, verifies that the applicant is in the stage of their program reported, is in good academic standing, is the lead author on the work being presented
- A long abstract: A maximum of 500 words not counting figures or tables that may be used to supplement the abstract (maximum of 2 tables and/or figures).
